

Know Your Rights

For encounters with ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement)



BE PREPARED

CREATE FAMILY SAFETY PLAN
AND HOLD IMPORTANT
DOCUMENTS & IMPORTANT
CONTACTS IN A FOLDER. Keep in
a safe place or with trusted person
for easy access.



DO NOT AGREE TO A WARRANTLESS SEARCH

UNLESS THEY HAVE A SIGNED WARRANT, you have the right to not give permission to search your car, home or person.



DO NOT OPEN HOME OR CAR DOOR!

COMMUNICATE THROUGH CLOSED DOOR OR WINDOW.

Agents can only enter your home with an arrest warrant signed by a judge.



YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO TAKE PHOTOS, VIDEOS AND WRITE NOTES

INFORM AGENTS YOU ARE GOING TO RECORD THEIR ACTIONS.

Take photos and record from your phone; or write down details.



YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REMAIN SILENT

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO SPEAK OR SIGN ANY DOCUMENT.

Communicate that you will not do anything without an attorney present.
